Key Factors of Modernization of the Economy of European Countries

Research Methodology. In the study of the nature and directions of modernization of the economies of European countries historical approach was used, in particular comparative-historical method helped to found general and specific features of modern economic transformation processes in Europe.

Results. The paper analyzed the major changes that have taken place in the economy of Europe during 1980-2010's. The most significant changes are observed – a significant shift in the structure of production factors and conditions as the classic factors added with information, knowledge, intellectual capital; reduction of primary and secondary sector of economy in favor of the service sector; deepening imbalances between demand and supply of labor at the labor market, and as a result structural unemployment grows; the distribution of energy saving processes and technologies.
